REGULATIONS OF THE SHOW

1. All Patrons will be issued a patrons badge. The minimum donation is £10 per badge which will allow free admission to the Show.
2. CUP RULE. The Winners of Challenge Cups still in competition shall undertake to return the Cup in good order and clean condition to the General Secretary on demand, the following year. Winners wishing to have their names inscribed on the Cups, should make arrangements to do so at their own expense in view of the increasing costs in staging the Show.
3. Objections to any exhibit must be made in writing and lodged with the Secretary, together with a deposit of ten Pounds not later than 4 o'clock or within half an hour of the Event on the day of the Show, any such objection shall be considered and decided if possible by the Judges and a committee of Inspection before the close of the Show.
4. All prize money to be paid on the day of the Show. (Sheep only)
5. No person shall be with the Judges, except the President and the appointed Stewards.
6. The Judges shall be directed to withhold the prize when they shall be of the opinion that there is not sufficient merit, or that the exhibit is not properly classed, and no second prize will be given unless there are more than THREE ENTRIES except on the special recommendations of the Judges.
7. The Judges' decision will be final.
8. That in the case of disagreement between judges, regarding any awards the General Secretary may be requested to call some members of the General Committee to appoint a Referee.
9. Any person offending against these Rules will be liable to forfeit all awards (if any) that he may otherwise be entitled to.
10. No responsibility will be accepted for any loss or damage done to or by any animals, or any other property of Competitors or Spectators.

AGRICULTURAL SECTION

Agricultural Regulations

1. Everything intended to be exhibited must be in the Show Ground until the Grand Parade is over.
2. All stock will be distinguished by a number only, corresponding to a list made by the Secretary.
3. All exhibits must be the property of the Exhibitor and owned for at least TWO MONTHS prior to the Show.
4. Records kept of ALL PREVIOUS WINNERS.
5. Cattle are only allowed to compete in 1 Breed Section.

HORTICULTURAL REGULATIONS (On with the Show)

- 1 All exhibits to be staged before 10.00 a.m. in the Horticultural Marquee. Exhibits may be staged from 4.30 p.m. on the Friday immediately before the Show. The Marquee will be closed promptly at 10.15 a.m. for judging.
- 2 All exhibits in the Horticultural and Home Produce Section must be bona-fide grown, produced or made by the exhibitor, except where otherwise stated.
- 3 Exhibits to remain in situ until after prize money given at 4.30 p.m. (NO EXCEPTIONS).
- 4 No entry will be accepted after the closing date Tuesday 7th August, 2018. N.B. Owing to increased work involved LATE ENTRIES ON MORNING OF SHOW WILL NO LONGER BE ACCEPTED.
- 5 Exhibitors are requested to name their varieties wherever possible.
- 6 All entries to be sent on the proper forms, not later than Tuesday 7th August, 2018 to **Mrs Edwina Fedrick, Bryn Seion, Brymbo, Eglwysbach, Colwyn Bay, Tel. 01492 650429 Mob: 07747 624770.**
- 7 All classes are open to bona-fide Amateur Gardeners who normally work their own gardens (except where otherwise stated).
- 8 All Prize Money to be collected from the Horticultural Marquee after 4.30 p.m.
- 9 All awards, cups and trophies to be returned to Edwina Fedrick, Bryn Seion, Brymbo, Eglwysbach at least 4 weeks before the next year's Show (ie before Saturday 14th July 2018).
- 10 Records kept of all previous cup winners to establish outright winners.
- 11 In the event of a tie in any competition involving the addition of points, the winner of most first prizes wins the Trophy.
- 12 TROPHIES including Replica Cups will be presented in the HORTICULTURAL MARQUEE at approximately 3.00 p.m.
- 13 The Judges shall be directed to withhold any prize when they shall be of the opinion that there is not sufficient merit, or that the exhibitor is not properly classed.
- 14 If an exhibitor does not place a card under exhibit, no prize to be awarded.
- 15 Prize Money not claimed on the day of the Show will be returned to Show Funds.
- 16 All Dahlia classes to be judged according to National Dahlia Society Rules.
- 17 All vegetable classes to be judged according to National Vegetable Society Rules.
- 18 If an entrant's entry fees amount to more than £6.00, they should enclose s.a.e. for receipt of one free entrance ticket.
- 19 A Rosette will be awarded to the Best Exhibit in each Section according to the Judge's decision.

GARDEN NEWS TOP TRAY : COMPETITION RULES

1. The Garden News Top Tray Class is for a collection of 3 types of vegetables taken from the following list of 15. The quantity of each vegetable required for the collection is given in brackets: Carrots (3), Cauliflowers (2), Onions (3), Parsnips (3), Peas (6 pods), Potatoes (3), Runner Beans (6 pods), Tomatoes (6), French Beans (6 pods), Sweetcorn (2), pepper (3), Cucumber (2), Courgettes (3), Red beet (3), Aubergines (2).

Each type of vegetable will be judged out of a total of 20 points. This is split into 3 Sections as follows: 7 points for size, shape and colour; 7 points for condition; 6 points for uniformity. The overall mark will be out of a total of 60.

2. All vegetables are to be displayed for effect. The vegetables must be displayed within an area measuring 45x60cm/18"x24" without bending any part of them. No part of any exhibit may exceed the size of the tray.

A tray or board measuring 45x60cm/18"x24" can be used to display the vegetables, or the area can simply be marked on the staging. Where a tray has a lip or edge, it is the internal measurements that must not exceed 45x60cm/18"x24".

3. A black cloth is permitted, and the tray may be painted. Parsley is allowed for garnishing, but no other foliage or accessories, such as plates, sand, rings and so on, will be allowed. Onion tops may be tied or whipped using raffia or string.

4. The winner of the Garden News Top Tray Class will receive a Garden News Certificate plus £10 worth of D.T. Brown vouchers. The Runner-up will receive a £5 D.T. Brown Voucher. Third place will receive a £3 D.T. Brown Voucher. These vouchers are to be used by December 31st 2018 for seeds via mail order only. (Vouchers cannot be redeemed for non-seed items or in conjunction with the additional Gardening Clubs discount).

* Carrots and parsnips must have foliage trimmed back to 7.5cm/3".

1. The Garden News Top Vase Class is for a vase of mixed flowering stems containing a total of between 5 and 10 stems, taken from a minimum of two different kinds of plants. Please note that it is two different KINDS of plants; 2 varieties of the same plant are NOT two kinds.
2. The display is judged out of a total of 35 points, split into: 25 points for the colour, form, condition, quality and freshness of the flowers on display, and 10 points for the overall presentation and effect of the flowers in the vase. The vase will be viewed from all directions. Judging of flowers should be to the normal rules used for other classes.
3. Stems used in the display must be showing flowers only; no seed heads or berries are allowed.
4. The vase can be any shape and size and made from any material, but must be in proportion to the display. No marks are awarded for the vase itself.
5. No accessories such as bows and additional foliage will be allowed. Foliage which is growing naturally from the flowering stem, and still attached to that stem is allowed. Packing material - including florists' foam - to keep the stems in place is allowed.
6. The winner of the Garden News Top Vase Class will receive a Garden News Certificate plus £10 worth of Mr Fothergill's vouchers. The runner-up will receive a £5 Mr Fothergill's voucher. Third place will receive a £3 Mr Fothergill's Voucher. These vouchers are to be used by December 31st 2018 for seeds via mail order only. (Vouchers cannot be redeemed for non-seed items or in conjunction with the additional Allotment Club and Garden Club Service discount).

NOTES FOR EXHIBITORS AND JUDGES

- * Flowering stems can be taken from ANY flowering plant.
- * The different kinds of plants need to be taken from different genera. For instance, pinks, carnations and sweet william - which are all dianthus - would not be classed as different kinds.
- * Use only fresh, home grown flowers. No dried or silk flowers allowed.
- * A vase, by definition, is any vessel that can be used to hold cut flowers and which is taller than it is wide at its widest point.
